LaRocca Seafood, provided fresh catch flown in specifically for guests. Upon arrival, attendees enjoyed an assortment of beverages

during cocktail hour, while hors d'oeuvers were passed around.

Special guest and KU Athletic Director, Sheahon Zenger, shared stories and insight as to his responsibilities to KU athletes, current and incoming. **Amy Hope:** Share your experience working with CVL and its members. What tasks have you undertaken so far in your term and what do you hope to accomplish?


