Pilot Transportation Program a Great Success

On August 30 as we launched a seven-week Pilot Transportation Program to supplement the existing transport options in Lawrence. Our aim was to fill gaps by offering evening and weekend rides, door-through-door assistance, on-call rides and multi-stop capability. Due to the dedication of so many won-derful volunteers we were able to provide a much needed service to the community.



A heralded musician, and a longtime supporter of CVL, Arnie Johnson provided the very first volunteer ride for a client who needed a ride to a chiropractor appointment, a quick trip to the grocery store and back home.



Our transportation service will pick back up in January as one of many volunteer services that CVL will provide its members.

Results the of trial program:

25 round-trip rides provided

12 volunteer drivers

30.25 hours of volunteer service

315 miles driven
